


## The History of LAB

The concept of a library association for Brevard County had its beginnings in 1980 at a meeting of public library reference librarians. The subject of a county-wide library organization was raised by Elizabeth Donovan, reference librarian at the Cocoa Public Library. The organization would be open to all library personnel in the county. It would provide them with an opportunity to meet other library workers and to participate in workshops and programs. The idea was received with enthusiasm, but the reality was to determine if enough interest existed among county library personnel to warrant such an organization. A committee consisting of Elizabeth Donovan, Jean Snyder, Margaret Ouzts, and Jean Mandros was delegated to draft a questionnaire for distribution to all potential members. The survey was prepared in September 1980, but it was not approved for distribution until August 1981. At that time, every full- and part-time library worker in the public library system was contacted. The results of the public library survey showed that 39% of the then 97 library employees were supportive. The next step was to survey all the other libraries in the county. The questionnaire was redrafted, and in October of 1981 copies were sent to every special, academic, and school library in the county. Out of 127 possible responses, 42% indicated definite interest. The time to organize had come.

The survey committee recommended that a steering committee be formed with representatives from every type of library and from every area of the county. The final task of the survey committee was to find these representatives and to contact established Florida library associations for general guidance in the formation of an organization. On April 20, 1982, these goals were accomplished when the newly created steering committee met for the first time at the Cocoa Public Library. The original steering committee was composed of:

At that initial meeting and subsequent ones, the steering committee selected a name for the association, drafted a constitution and by-laws, formatted a newsletter, and set up a schedule of programs for 1982/83. The idea of a library association for Brevard County had become a reality.

## **Library Association of Brevard Bylaws**

### **Article I: Name**

The name of this Association shall be the Library Association of Brevard (LAB).

### **Article II: Purpose**

The purposes of this Association shall be:

1. To promote general library interests and services, and to encourage interlibrary cooperation within Brevard County.
2. To encourage the professional development of the membership.
3. To cooperate with state, regional, and national organizations interested in the promotion of library affairs.
4. To promote fraternal relations among librarians and those interested in library affairs.

### **Article III: Membership**

#### Section 1

Membership in the Library Association of Brevard shall be open to any active, former, or retired library or information center worker, library student, or other interested party and shall be conferred upon payment of annual dues.

#### Section 2

Institutions/Organizations may join as non-voting members.

#### Section 3

- (a.) Annual dues for individual members shall be \$5.
- (b.) Lifetime memberships may be purchased for a one-time payment of \$100.
- (c.) Annual dues for an institution/organization, up to eleven employees, shall be \$50. Additional memberships shall be at the individual rate of \$5.

#### Section 4

Any member who has failed to pay dues by December 31 of the year shall be considered a delinquent member and automatically dropped from the membership roll.

### Section 5

Any member who is in arrears for dues for the current year shall not be permitted to vote or hold office in the Association.

### Section 6

(a.) The fiscal year of the Association shall run from July 1 through June 30.

(b.) The membership year for the Association shall be the same as the calendar year.

(c.) Annual membership dues are payable to the Library Association of Brevard, online or by mail.

## **Article IV: Officers**

### Section 1

The officers of the Association shall be a President, a Vice-president/President-elect, a Secretary, a Treasurer, a Membership Chair, a Marketing Chair, and other officers deemed necessary.

### Section 2: Nominations and Elections of Officers

Nominees from the Executive Board shall be announced to the general membership through email and/or the Association's website. At the spring meeting, additional nominations may be taken from the floor, provided that the consent of the nominee has been previously obtained. If there are no further nominations, the slate as presented shall be voted on by those members present. If there are nominations from the floor, the officers shall be elected by direct mail or email at least one month prior to the annual banquet. Only members in good standing shall be able to vote or run for office.

### Section 3: Duties of Officers

(a.) The President shall preside over all meetings of the Association and the Executive Board, and shall conduct the business of the Association. The President shall appoint all committees of the Association.

(b.) The Vice-president/President-elect shall act for the President upon request or in the case of the absence of the President. The Vice-president/President-elect shall be the Program Chairperson. The Vice-president/President-elect shall succeed to the office of President, after the summer banquet.

(c.) The Secretary shall keep a complete file of the records of the proceedings of all meetings of the Association and the Executive Board, shall maintain the Association's archives, and shall carry on the correspondence of the Association.

(d.) The Treasurer shall be responsible for handling the Association's funds, keeping itemized records of receipts and expenditures, and all other associated activities. The Treasurer shall disburse the monies of the Association upon the approval of the Executive Board. The Treasurer will submit written reports, biannually, to the membership at the summer Banquet and to the Executive Board at their winter meeting. All funds and records of the Association shall be transferred to the newly elected Treasurer within thirty (30) days after the end of the fiscal year.

#### Section 4: Terms of Office

The President of the Association shall be elected and serve for one year. Officers of the Association shall be elected for one year and may be re-elected to serve up to three years. After serving three consecutive terms in an office, preference will be given to new candidates. Terms of office to begin after the summer banquet.

#### Section 5: Vacancies

Vacancies in office shall be filled by the Executive Board for the unexpired portion of the term of office, except in the case of a vacancy in the Presidency, which shall be filled by the Vice-President/President-Elect. A new Vice-President/President-Elect shall be elected by the membership at the earliest opportunity, should that position become vacant.

### **Article V: Meetings**

#### Section 1

(a.) There shall be a minimum of four meetings of the Association per year, Winter Social (January/February), Spring Educational Meeting or Service Project (March/April), Fall Educational Meeting (October/November), Summer Banquet (June/July).

(b.) Times and places of meetings shall be determined by the Executive Board.

(c.) Business matters of the Association shall be conducted at all meetings with the exception of the annual summer banquet.

## **Article VI: Executive Board**

### Section 1

The Executive Board shall consist of the duly elected officers of the Association, the Immediate Past-President, the Membership Chair and the Marketing Chair, who shall be appointed by the President.

### Section 2

The administration of the affairs of the Association shall be vested in the Executive Board.

### Section 3: Meetings

(a.) The Executive Board shall meet prior to each meeting of the Association. Special meetings may be called by the President.

(b.) A quorum for the Executive Board shall be at least one-half of the Executive members.

## **Article VII: Committees**

### Section 1

Standing committees may be established by the Executive Board. The name, purpose, and size of the committee shall be specified at the time it is established. The chairperson and other members of each committee will be named by the President of the Association.

### Section 2

Ad hoc committees may be established by the President of the Association as needed.

### Section 3

Any committee may be discontinued or declared inactive by the Executive Board.

## **Article VIII: Dissolution of the Association**

In the event the Library Association of Brevard is dissolved, all monies in the treasury, after current bills are paid, shall be given to an institution/organization designated by a majority vote of members present at the final meeting.

## **Article IX: Official Publication**

A Membership Directory shall be compiled and distributed to all members by the summer banquet.
